When wearing shoes that tie, Tying your Shoes Tight before meetings or before leaving your home *will make you feel more confident.* This does not work with every shoe, especially loafers.

An Email is Worth 100 Meetings

People Without Authority Continue to Argue

When a person does not have authority, they will continue to argue or say that it cannot be done. Once it is recognized that the person is arguing too much, simply ask:

"Do you have the authority to do what I am asking, because if not, then there is no reason for us to continue this discussion." I would like to talk to someone above you, who has the authority to do what I am asking.

Sometimes when asking to speak to a supervisor or a manager, a person might state:

"My manager will tell you the same thing!" Then calmly state, "Let's find out."

Get Something Done

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Demeanor

Judges carefully watch a witness's testimony by observing their *Demeanor, which is their* appearance, attitude, and conduct.

Remember Conversations, Events, or Phrases by Connecting them to Bright Colors

If you want to make sure to remember a conversation, event, or phrase; while it is happening, *look for the brightest color in your field of view and then mentally connect the color to the* conversation, event, or phrase.

When recalling the conversation, event, or phrase; first remember the color and then the conversation, event, or phrase will come to you.

Police Officers and Private Detectives use this method to remember events in order to write reports.

Remember Mental Notes by Associating with Physical Movements

Before a meeting, if you realize that you speak too long when answering a question, give yourself a mental note to "Sum up Your Conversation," when you shift in your seat.

We all shift in our seats. By connecting the idea to *Sum up Your Conversation* to shifting in your seat, it associates or connects an idea to a physical movement so that you will remember.

Some Actors and Actresses use this process by connecting hand and body movements when they perform to remember their lines. Some *Speakers* use this process by connecting frequent motioning with their left hand and then their right hand at specific parts of their speech. This process works well with a 30-Second or an Elevator Speech too.

It is difficult to not say "We, Us, or Our" after leaving an organization. A good way to remember not to use "We, Us, or Our" is to associate the physical movement of *lifting your right hand to represent* the *mental note* of the Company, Organization, or Name and *lifting your left hand to represent* the Client, Customer, or Patron.

Modified Jazz Hands (hands extended with palms up and fingers spread without movement) can be associated to remember Outcomes, Results, or Triumphs and to say "The result was..."

Dear Ambassador:

The World needs a Simple International Help Symbol. The symbol could simply be an Inverted Equilateral Triangle with a Line through the Middle, which is also what Aristotle established as the alchemical symbol for Earth. It is similar to flying a flag upside down, which is a signal of distress.

With only four lines, it could easily be made using logs on a beach, or deserted Island, or painted on a roof during a flood.

"SOS" the Universal Distress Signal, is made using fourteen (14) lines.

Spelling out HELP in English requires 12 lines and Help in other languages is spelled differently:

French: Idez-moi, Spanish: Ayuda, Italian: Aiuto, German: Hilfe, Yiddish: Hilf

<u>Give a Gift</u>

Remember how your parents taught you to never go to someone's house without a gift? If you do not hear from a someone such as a recruiter or interviewer, after a couple of weeks, search for an interesting "Free" article on the industry or company using Google or a Blog Search Engine such as: <u>www.blogsearchengine.org</u>. 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Conversation

Sharing is the action we take just before doing.

Modify discussions according to the audience. If they are not in your field do not be so specific.

Then pause while waiting for the listener to recognize you. It helps the talker to listen more carefully and then they will not feel that you are trying to talk over them.

Expressions

Few people know how expressions get started, but *expressions convey both feelings and words by using less time and space.*

Will It Improve My Situation

If someone indifferently says, "You can try it if you want." Ask "Do you think it will improve my situation?"

Silly Questions

When a person asks a silly question, showing that they simply do not understand, do not get mad or think that you know more than they do. Quietly say to yourself with a *New York accent: This guy's an idiot!* Just don't say it out loud.

It Is What It Is; Seldom is True

It Is What It Is; seldom is true since things are constantly changing, it too easily accepts a loss, and it diminishes creativity. In this computer age *few things are the same as they were five years ago*, so base decisions on updates.

Transferring Physical Things the Same Way

When Transferring Physical Things; *always go in the same direction.* If Right Handed, go from Left (older things) to Right (newer things); the same way we read English. This works well for *eggs, pants pockets, and purses.* Transfer the opposite direction if Left Handed.

Directions — Your Left Hand Looks Like an "L"

If you hold out your hands straight in front of you with your thumbs extended pointing to each other, your Left Hand forms a capital "L." For directions, you can do this on top of a steering wheel.

To save time when writing directions, for Left write an "L" and for Right write an "R," but circle them.

Sports — Basketball

When shooting a Basketball, *pretend* you are looking down on the hoop from above, put an *Imaginary Red Target inside the hoop*, then from the floor aim for the Red Bullseye in the Center of the Target. *With the Right Tool and a Little Imagination, You Can Do Anything!*

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Handshake

A Firm Handshake when meeting people makes a *Good First Impression*. Do not try to squeeze their hand too hard but show that you are confident and look them in the eye while shaking hands. Some men are cautious to shake a women's hand too hard.

Answering Phones and Voice Mail Messages

Answer Cell Phones and Landlines with "<u>Hello this is</u> <u>First Name</u>." It saves time so that the caller does not have to ask for First Name Last Name (You).

When leaving a Voice Mail Message, start with "<u>Hello, this is First Name Last Name</u>. <u>Please call me</u> <u>back at (000) 000-0000</u>." Then leave the message, followed at the end with: "<u>Once again this is First</u> <u>Name Last Name at (000) 000-0000</u>. <u>Thank you</u>." Leaving your contact information at the beginning and at the end makes it is easier someone to reach you; and they do not have to replay the message.

Scammers Calling

When a scammer calls a landline and the caller ID is not recognized, after the first ring answer using the speaker phone, but then *immediately presses the mute button before the second ring.*

Since the scammer's computer does not hear any sounds, it thinks that the phone number is bad and takes it off their list. This works well with cell phones too, but it may take longer to key the buttons.

Test Taking Highlighted

Use a Pen Style Highlighter and a Pen in each hand to quickly keep track of who did what when taking lengthy tests such as essay questions or long multiple choice questions with extensive issues like the Multistate Bar Exam. In the question, *Underline the person or thing using the Pen* in one hand and *Highlight what they did* using Highlighter in the other hand. Left, right, left, right — it's like drumming.

Stealth Aircraft

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Return to Alphabetical Index Computers, Smartphones, and Tablets; Oh My Return to Table of Contents For an Exact Internet Search

On the browser search line *place Quotation marks ("") before and after a specific word or phrase*, which is a *Boolean Search Modifier*. Otherwise, the phrase will be split up and searched only by word. To quickly search a website or document, hold down the *Control button and then key F.* to Find or Search something on a screen saves time because the software is faster than an eye.

Find Spell Check Errors by Copying Resume to Text then to a Blank Word

The best way to proofread to discover *Spelling, Grammar, and Typographical Errors* is to copy your résumé or document into a *Blank Plain Text File (.txt)*, then copy the Blank Plain Text File into a Blank Word Document and perform a spell check.

A *Plain Text File or Text File (.txt)* drops all formats including hidden formats, so that when copied into a word file, it is a fresh document and spell check should discover any errors. This process can be used for any document and is a great way to discover errors!

Keep a Blank Text File (.txt) on your computer desktop to conveniently use this process.

Passwords

When you have difficulty spelling a word like Wednesday, make it part of your password.

If you generally write using all caps, when handwriting passwords on lined paper, write upper case letters above the line and *lower case letters on the line* so that the line goes through them. When handwriting passwords on paper without lines, write upper case letters normally, but write lower case letters with a line through them.

Password Managers

In today's world with so many passwords constantly changing, it is hard to remember all of them.

<u>LastPass</u> [www.lastpass.com] is a freemium password manager that stores encrypted passwords online. The standard version of LastPass comes with a web interface but also includes plugins for various web browsers and apps for many smartphones. A 2017 Consumer Reports article described LastPass as one of the four popular password managers (alongside <u>1Password</u>, <u>Dashlane</u> and <u>KeePass</u>), with the choice among them mostly up to personal preferences. https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/LastPass

Backup a Flash Drive with another Flash Drive

If you do not have a computer or an account that will back up data in the "Cloud," save your data on *another Flash Drive* using a computer with two USB Ports.

A Totally 100% Free reverse phone lookup that lets you find out who owns a cell phone or landline even if non-published. Once a cell phone number is keyed it will even play the outgoing message. Then you can hear the owner's name or try to recognize the owner's voice. <u>http://www.spydialer.com</u>

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Posting Meetings — Use the Five "W's — Who, What, Where, When, Why

When posting meetings, the author should answer the Five "W's;" *Who, What, Where, When Why.* Remember this by stating the old *Abbott and Costello* skit, *but I added some characters.*

When posting calendar appointments post 30 minutes before but in the body key Appointment at 0:00.

Hello, is Better Than Good Morning

For email greetings, it is better to write Hello rather than Good Morning because the recipient could review the email any time of day. Good Morning also shows that the sender may be self-adsorbed and might not understand another person's point-of-view or be receptive to new ideas. Writing Hi or Greetings are also acceptable, but not Hey or Howdy.

Scan and Save Important Papers then Recycle

Instead of collecting tons of papers, when a document arrives that you want to keep for future use, simply *Scan the document* on an advanced printer, *save the scan as an .pdf* in a computer file labeled *"Important Papers,"* then *tear the paper in fourths*, and *put it in the h bin*. If you need the document, it can always be searched and found on your computer.

To use less ink when printing a document, first print it as a .pdf, save, and then print the .pdf.

Alt Keys, Function Keys, and Mouse Clicks

I once heard that when Microsoft was starting, the leadership could not agree on the very best way to control a computer. Finally, Bill Gates said, *"From now on, Microsoft will always control a computer three ways; Alt Keys, Function Keys, and Mouse Clicks!"*

Everyone who speaks a language speaks it with an accent.

<u>The Speech Accent Archive</u> is established to *uniformly exhibit a large set of speech accents* from a variety of language backgrounds. Native and non-native speakers of English all read the same English paragraph and are carefully recorded. The archive is *constructed as a teaching tool and as a research tool*. It is meant to be used by linguists as well as other people who simply wish to listen to and compare the accents of different English speakers.

<u>The Speech Accent Archive</u> allows users to compare the demographic and linguistic backgrounds of the speakers in order to determine which variables are key predictors of each accent. The speech accent archive demonstrates that accents are systematic rather than merely mistaken speech.

<u>English Phonetics and Phonology</u> - This paragraph when spoken includes most of the sounds of the English language. Every person using their own accent reads the following paragraph:

"Please call Stella. Ask her to bring these things with her from the store: Six spoons of fresh snow peas, five thick slabs of blue cheese, and maybe a snack for her brother Bob. Clear Prescriptions Containers

When storing semi-transparent or *Clear Prescriptions Containers*; face the container out so the clear *slit* between the label's edges shows the amount remaining. Then it is easy to know when to reorder.

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U.S. has Five Types of Healthcare Insurance

Currently, in the U.S. there are five types of Healthcare Insurance:

Private-Through an Employer, Medicare, Medicaid, Obamacare, and VA (Veterans Administration)

If all five Healthcare Insurers merged into one National Healthcare policy, then since there would be a greater number of insurers in the "Insurance Pool" to absorb the risks, the premiums would be less and yet provide better coverage.

This merger could start by consolidating Medicare and the VA (Veterans Administration; just as military bases have merged into Joint Bases to save money.

COBRA Healthcare Insurance

When an employee is covered under an Employer's Healthcare Insurance, the employee pays a piece of it and the employer pays a piece of it.

When a former employee is offered COBRA Healthcare Insurance the employee pays both pieces, which is why it is expensive.

If an employer declares *Chapter 7 Bankruptcy it is dissolved* and will no longer offer employee healthcare insurance or Cobra.

Original Medicare Application

By federal law, Original Medicare (Part A) must be applied for in a seven month window:

Three months before the month you turn 65,

The month you turn 65,

Three months after the month you turn 65.

If Original Medicare (Part A) is not applied for within this window, then there might be penalties.

The only exception is if you are still working full time for an employer who offers health insurance.

Generally, Original Medicare (Part A) covers 100% of Hospital visits,

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When opening a small box or carton, first on the small edge squeeze the ends together so that the glued flap on the edge pops up.

Closing Food Zip Storage Bags

The pressure from your finger pushes the tracks against the hard counter making it easier to close and seal.

Matching Bottom Plate as a Trivet

When microwaving on a plate that will be eaten off, for a convent Trivet to protect the table, use a matching plate, which will not move as food is being cut.

Keep Your Smallest Finger below a Container to Avoid Spills

Dry Towels Faster on Rack by Overlapping Ripple Folding

Towels dry faster on towel rack when overlapping ripple folding so that the air flows in between them.

Kitchen towels on a refrigerator door will dry faster when spread stored on the side rather the middle.

When shirts have worn-out their color on the edge of the sleeves, edge of the collar, or pants have spots of worn-out color purchase a *Fine-Point Permanent Color Marker* the same color and dye the white spot, which will permanently remain even after many washers.

This method can also be used when spilled cleaners have bleached the color out of shirts or pants.

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Pulled Over By a Police Officer

If a pulled over by a Police Officer, immediately: *Turn on your Right Blinker, Where it is Safe, Pull as Far to the Right as possible, Put Down Your Window, Place Both Hands on the Steering Wheel where the officer can see them.*

Since the Officer does not know if you have a weapon, do not look for your license and registration until the officer asks for them.

If the officer asks, *"Do you know why I pulled you over?" Simply say, "I do not know."* If you say that you think you were speeding, then you will get a ticket for speeding.

Unmarked police cars should still have flashing emergency lights and a siren.

Don't Blow Your Horn

Instead of blowing your horn at another driver, Just Brake.

In the seconds it takes to blow your horn, which also *scares all the surrounding drivers*, you will travel a number of feet that could result in an accident. Try to avoid accidents no matter who is at fault!

Air Conditioning Helps Filter Air

When there is a lot of pollen in the air, stuck in a slow moving tunnel, or behind a smelly vehicle; turn on the A/C to help filter the air; and add heat if cold outside. As the fresh air passes through the cold A/C evaporator coils it deposits moisture, which helps filter the fresh air before going into the cabin.

Air, Gas, Elec, Oil

For internal combustion engines in most cars, if it is not working, generally it is because it does not have—<u>Air</u> (*Oxygen to feed the explosion above the piston*), <u>Gas</u> (*Gasoline fuel to explode to push the piston*), <u>Elec</u> (*Electricity to spark the fuel to ignite*), and <u>Oil</u> (*Lubrication to keep the pistons* movable)

Shine Cellphone Flashlight Diode Directly into Opaque Tank to View Engine Fluids

Keep the Engine Off. Open the Engine compartment. Open a Vehicle Opaque Plastic Fluid Tank. Place a Cellphone Flashlight Diode directly on top of the open tank *so that the <u>Light Shines Through</u> <u>the Plastic.</u> Then view the liquid level. If the liquid level cannot be seen in daylight, try it at night.*

This works great when viewing the Brake Fluid Tank, Coolant Overflow Tank, Power Steering Fluid Tank, Windshield Washer Fluid Tank, and any other Opaque Plastic see through containers. While checking fluids, check that the Engine Oil Level is in the normal range on the dipstick. Remove the Dipstick and wipe it clean. Insert the Dipstick again and remove it once more for a clean reading.

Oil Filter Does Not Loosen Put A Paper Towel Over It

If an *Oil Filter* will not loosen, put a *Paper Towel* over the *Oil Filter*. Use the Oil Filter Wrench on top of the *Paper Towel* and unscrew the *Oil Filter*. The paper towel helps the oil filter wrench grab the oil filter. To make a better seal, rub a little oil on the rubber gasket of the new oil filter.

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Place a Sheet of White Paper Under Vehicle Leaks To Identify Fluids

Placing a White Sheet of Printout Paper with a Rock under leaks can identify the type of fluid leaking.

Engine Oil- *Brownish Black* floats a *Rainbow*, Transmission Fluid- Red, Antifreeze Coolant- *Greenish Yellow*, and *Tastes Sweet* because of Glycerol, Brake Fluid- *Yellowish Clear*, Power Steering Fluid-*Brownish Clear*, Windshield Washer Fluid- *Blue*, A/C Condensation Water- Clear.

Before It Rains Use Windshield Washer Fluid to Clean Windows

Cleaning windows just before it rains cleans off the gunk and makes windshield wipers work better.

Use Clear Liquid Silicone on Older Door Gaskets to Waterproof

Lightly Brushing Liquid Silicone on Older Vehicle's Door Gaskets will Soften and Slightly Expand the Gaskets, making them waterproof. You can buy Liquid Silicone at this website. https://www.walmart.com/ip/Herman-Survivors-Liquid-Silicone-4-oz/703127945

Windex Loosens Automotive Electrical Connectors

Spraying a lot of Windex on Automotive Electrical Connectors; especially in the engine compartment, *removes the dirt, grease, and oil,* but also loosens it up so that it can be easily removed. Windex works great on *Sliding Red Locking Tabs and* using a *Right Angled Screwdriver* rather than a regular screwdriver helps to give a solid push on the tab.

Using WD-40 (*Literally stands for Water Displacement*), would have removed the water, and dried up the Electrical Connector, making it susceptible to cracks.

Extended Warranty Plans

Generally, Extended Warranty Plans (Mechanical Breakdown Protection Plans) are not worth purchasing because Extended Warranty Plans try <u>not</u> to cover repairs by claiming that the repair is "<u>Normal or Routine Maintenance</u>."

Before purchasing an Extended Warranty Plan, determine if the vehicle must be taken only to the *Warranty Companies Certified Mechanic* or Repair Shop and *who decides if the repair is covered*, the repair shop or the Warranty Company?

Are policy holders required to pay the repair shop first and then receive reimbursement from the warranty company? Traditionally, car not running well, or using too much oil, or a blown head gasket, or running an engine without oil, or simply old age will not be covered.

Generally, Extended Warranty Plans for Appliances or Household Equipment are also not worth purchasing because Extended Warranty Plans try <u>not</u> to cover repairs by claiming that the repair is "<u>Normal or Routine Maintenance</u>."

Some credit cards double the manufacturer's warranty.

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To Remember a Ship Directions — Port and Starboard

<u>Port and Starboard</u> are nautical terms of orientation that deal unambiguously with the structure of vessels, <u>referring respectively to the left and right sides of the vessel</u>, as seen by an observer aboard the vessel looking forward toward the bow. <u>https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Port_and_starboard</u>

Author Bill Lewandowski gives a great mnemonic phrase to remember Port and Starboard directions.

<u>There is no **RED PORT Wine** LEFT in the bottle</u>

When facing towards the Bow or front of the ship:

In English, the word PORT has 4 letters and so does the word LEFT.

Sta<u>R</u>boa<u>R</u>d has 2 letter R's and is RIGHT.

For Ship Navigational Lights, **PORT is RED**; same color as Port Wine; and **STARBOARD is GREEN**.

Recycle

Grocery and Other Plastic Bags

To make it easier to *Find, Store, and Transport* plastic bags to recycle, *place the same brand and size bags in one bag* and then store them in a large plastic bag in the closet until ready to recycle.

Ripped Plastic Bags can be *tied in a knot* and then also stored in the large plastic bag for recycling.

Pick Up Street Recyclables

When walking outdoors *pick up discarded Glass Bottles, Metal Cans, and Plastic Containers* and carry them in a *strong Big Box Hardware Store bag* and then dump them in a recycle can on the street or in your own recycle can.

Getting them off the street helps the environment, even if they are not recycled.

Shredded Papers are Not Recyclable

Unfortunately, shredded papers are Not normally able to be recycled and must be disposed of separately.

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Home Ownership

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Rent with the Option to Buy Clause

When renting a house, ask the owner if they will allow a <u>Rent with the Option to Buy Clause</u> also known as a <u>Rent-to-own Agreement</u> or a <u>Lease-option Agreement</u>, where some of the monthly rent paid, contributes toward the down payment to purchase the property at a set purchase price.

This is a great way to eventually purchase a house when funds are limited, or credit is poor. If the renter is an employee of a company, willing to reimburse the employee renting a family house, then a *Rent with the Option to Buy Clause* is a great way to legally purchase a house and increase assets.

County Assessment

Generally in a good economy, the county, city, or locality appraised value of a property is valued less that the going market. It may be a good buy to purchase a property for the local assessed value.

Most localities do not physically appraise a property every year but simply add an inflation percentage plus a percentage of the localities infrastructure improvements to the appraised value.

When challenging localities appraised value of a property, find *three similar properties closely matching your property, such as a Ranch, Bi-level or Tri-level, but they must be in your neighborhood. Then add or subtract the value of items* that your property does or does not have, such as a garage.

Large Purchase Home Equipment

It appears that many Big Box Hardware Stores *lower the price of Large Purchase Home Equipment* (Fixtures) such as Air Conditioners, Heat Pumps, Whole House Generators, Hot Water Heaters, and Kitchen Cabinets, *but they increase the price of installation labor*. It saves money to purchase the *Large Purchase Home Equipment* from them but have someone else install it.

Mowing the Lawn

When mowing a lawn, try to mow in a circle or square with the *mower side discharge shooting outward* so that the new clippings are evenly distributed on the lawn that has already been cut.

Raking Leaves

When Raking Leaves use a Snow Shovel to help scoop up piles of leaves and acorns into plastic bags but using a lawnmower with a bagger is faster and uses less plastic bags.

You <u>cannot</u> be a Perfectionist Raking Leaves, Raising Children, and Reconsidering Apologies.

Using a Spreader Line Up with a Distant Mark

When using a lawn spreader to deposit Fertilizer, Seed, Weed Killer, or something else, pick a distant mark like a Mailbox, Light Post, or Fence Post to line up with, so that what your spreading is eventually distributed, and you do not miss any parts of the lawn.

Buy Three, But Install Two

When installing things like Braided Stainless Steel Faucet Supply Lines; always *Buy Three but Install Two; in case one is bad. Then you don't have to go to the store during a repair* and can return it later.

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Blow Out Dryer Vents with a Yard Blower

First unhook the dryer vent from the dryer, attach an *Electric* Yard Blower, but wrap connection with packing tape, not duct tape, turn it on and the lint will blow out. If that does not work buy a new one.

Dust First Vacuum Next

When cleaning, dust first, which makes some of the dust drop to the floor, then vacuum the floor. A *Wax Coated Duster* that has paraffin wax baked into cotton strands will lift and remove the dust better than an old fashioned feather duster, which will just push the dust around.

Pick Up Spots of Powder in Carpet with Tape

If the wall-to-wall carpeting near your bathroom has spots of powder, use a small piece of adhesive tape, and *dab the spots with the sticky side of the tape to pull out the powder,* and then dispose of the tape. Rubbing the powder into the carpet might cause problems with the rug.

Clean Kitchen Oil Finished Wooden Butcher Blocks or Cutting Boards

Sprinkle the boards with Kosher Salt, which has large crystals, and then scrub the salt into the boards with half a Lemon or Lemon Juice with a paper towel <u>going the same as the grain of the wood</u>. The salt and lemon mixture will *clean, disinfect, and remove stains* on the board.

Next, wipe with a soft cloth to remove the salt, lemon, and dirt. Let the wood dry overnight. Do not use water on the board because it might warp the wood.

After drying for about a day, season the wood with mineral oil. Experts recommend John Boos Mystery Oil. <u>https://www.amazon.com/John-Boos-MYSB-Mystery-Butcher/dp/B00063QPYQ</u>

Cleaning Rust or any Stain from Stainless Steel

For rust stains on *scissors, sinks, or silverware* (but not real silver) use <u>Bar Keepers Friend</u> an exceptional cleaning product that makes stainless steel resistant to oxidation via the process of passivation and can remove rust on stainless steel. <u>https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Bar_Keepers_Friend</u> <u>Bar Keepers Friend Soft Cleanser</u> is a creamy soft cleanser that clings to vertical surfaces for easy cleaning indoors and outdoors and wipes away cleanly, for a streak-free shine. It easily removes soap scum, rust stains, tarnish, and mineral deposits. It also comes in a powder.

Roof — Shingle-over Ridge Vent

When having a roof installed ask for a Shingle-over Ridge Vent that *provides continuous natural ventilation in the attic.* As heat rises in the attic, it flows to the highest point, which is the Ridge, and then escapes to the outside, making the attic cooler. Make sure the Soffit Vents on the underside of the home's eaves (edges of the roof that overhang the wall) are not clogged with insulation.

Top Shed Plywood Covering with Vinyl Flooring

When constructing a metal or woodshed, by using *Full-length Sheet Vinyl to cover the plywood flooring*, it keeps out the moisture from the ground, stops liquids from soaking into the plywood, and makes the shed look nice and clean; especially when a Wood-look Sheet Vinyl is used.

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Stop Floor Squeaks by Driving Wood Screws into Plywood Floorboards Studs

To stop squeaks, when replacing carpet, after the old carpet is removed, using a screw gun or drill, drive in *2.5-inch Flat-Head Interior Wood Screws into the Plywood Floorboard's Studs,* spacing them 5-inches apart. Coat each screw with *Paraffin Wax* that melts going in and keeps the screws tight.

Use Furniture Polish To Loosen Things

Furniture Polish can loosen anything that moves-Kitchen Faucet Sprayers, Shower Wands, Windows.

Window Roller Shade Shock Adsorber

When installing Roller Shades *wind a couple of thick rubber bands* between the cardboard tube and the *end* of the Plastic End Plug. The Shade might be longer, but the shock adsorber keeps it in place.

Open Your Windows

The air we breathe should have plenty of Oxygen (O2). The EPA notes that *outside air is about 21% oxygen* at sea level. The OSHA Respiratory Protection Standard considers any atmosphere with an oxygen level *below 19.5 percent to be oxygen-deficient* and dangerous to life or health.

Oxygen-deficient atmospheres may be the result of stagnant air caused by a lack of ventilation or the consumption of oxygen by reactions taking place in the space — the oxidation process of rust, for example. Biological actions — such as the breakdown of organic materials through bacterial action — may also consume oxygen. An oxygen deficiency can also be caused by introducing an inert gas such as nitrogen in the atmosphere. www.fireengineering.com/articles/print/volume-150/issue-2/features/monitoring-hazardous-atmospheres.html

Since residential air conditioners, heat pumps, and furnaces only re-circulate the same air and do not inject fresh air, most houses only have about 19% to 20% oxygen environment and fans and ceiling fans only move the same air. Gas Stoves, Gas Furnaces, Oil Furnaces, and Fireplaces all deplete the oxygen levels in a house.

Incidentally, the greater the oxygen the better the food tastes, which is why food tastes better outdoors. So, Open Your Windows!

Date Heat Pump or Air Conditioner Filters

When changing a Heat Pump or Air Conditioner Filter once a year, write the date on the edge of the new filter so that it can be seen when the cover is removed. Next year you will know when to change.

Deflect Air From Vents Near Drapes

When A/C vents are blowing drapes or behind a sofa, place *Two Facing Magnetic Adjustable Air Deflectors* on vents leaving a one inch gap to allow air to flow out without disturbing the drapes. Put *Magnetic Adjustable Air Deflectors on ceiling vents* to blow air across the ceiling, not down a wall.

Running Water in Unused Bathrooms Keeps Out Sewer Smells

At least once a week run water in Unused Sinks, Showers, and flush Toilets to keep the U-shaped P-traps full of water, which prevents smelly sewer gas vapors from entering the home.

Keep the Heat In

Insulate exposed *Hot Water Pipes using Rubber Tubular Pipe Insulation* to keep the heat in the pipe. Do not insulate exposed cold water pipes, which need to warm up from the air in the house.

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 Mirrors Brighten a Room
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Placing a *Large Mirror on the wall or installing Sliding Mirrored Closet Doors* in a room reflects daylight around the room; making it brighter and at night they reflect lamp light; making the room lighter.

Interior Decorators recommend placing Mirrors opposite a window to bounce the light around the room for the best effect.

<u>Furniture</u>

For Wooden Furniture, examine the Lacquer, Type of Wood, and Workmanship to determine value.

<u>Lacquer</u> — Used to cover materials like wood, maybe clear or tinted and produces a hard, durable finish that protects the wood. The finish or sheen may be from matte to high gloss.

Type of Wood

Pine - Softwood susceptible to dings and scratches and not recommended for furniture. Maple - Hardwood and known for its strength and durability.

Oak - Hardwood has a longstanding reputation of both beauty and strength.

Cherry - Hardwood stands up to dings dents and scratches.

Workmanship — The art or skill a workman used when producing skillfully crafted furniture.

Tool Bag, Toolbox, or Tool Chest

Besides the regular tools, in a Tool Bag, Toolbox, or Tool Chest, place a couple of medium and large *Binder Clips*, some *Wire Twist Ties*, some Strong *Rubber Bands*, a Large *Nail Clipper* for cutting small wires and filing, Small Roll of Duct Tape, and *Work Gloves*.

Find Nuts, Bolts, Screws or Washers on the Ground

When you see *Nuts, Bolts, Screws or Washers on the ground* pick them up and put them in a home container for future use, but if they are rusted, throw them away. This helps the environment, gets you a free collection that you may need to fix something, and may stop someone from getting flat tire.

Repair Fasteners in a Butter or Margarine Container

When repairing or working on something, *put Fasteners* — *Nuts, Bolts, Screws and Washers* in a clean plastic Butter or Margarine Container so they do not get lost. If you have to stop, close the lid.

Look for © Copyright Year on Label

When buying online the © Copyright Year on the magnified label informs if it is old merchandise.

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Emergency

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Emergency Evacuation Kit - in Closet

Create an easy to reach and grab Emergency Evacuation Bag on a closet shelf containing:

Whistles, First-Aid Kit, Wind-Up Radio & Flashlight, Garbage Bags *for storage*, Gallon Zip Bags *for wet clothes*, Moist Toilets, Face Mask, Envelopes+ Paper+ Pens in zip bag *for notes*, Energy Bars, Mess Kits, Plyers, Multi-Function Pocketknife, Ratchet Tie-Down Straps, Map.

Vehicle's Panic Alarm to Attract Emergency Vehicles

In an emergency, after dialing 911 and then waiting for the Rescue Vehicle, Fire Department, or Police Officer to arrive, *once you see them at a distance, Use Your Vehicle's Panic Alarm To Attract Their Attention,* so that they can locate your quicker, but it will *Stay On, Until Turned Off.*

Emergency Weather

Hide From Wind, Run From Water, Rise From Flood, Stay Warm From Snow

Destructive Weather - Winter Storms, Floods, Tornados, and Wind - Advisory, Watch, or Warning

To alert the public about <u>Winter Storms</u>, the <u>National Weather Service</u> explains the difference between a Winter Storm Advisory, Watch, and Warning: https://www.weather.gov/ilx/wwa_social

<u>Winter Weather Advisory</u> - Issued for Snow of 3 to 5 inches in 12 hours, sleet accumulation up to 1/4 inch, freezing rain in combination with sleet and/or snow or blowing snow.

<u>Winter Storm Warning</u> - Indicates that heavy snow of at least 6 inches in 12 hours, or at least 8 inches in 24 hours, is expected. It can also be issued if sleet accumulation will be at least half an inch.

<u>Winter Storm Watch</u>. Conditions favorable for a winter storm that is a threat to life or property <u>Freezing Rain Advisory</u> indicates that ice accumulation of up to 1/4 inch is expected **Ice Storm Warning** - Indicates that ice accumulation of at least 1/4 inch is expected.

Blizzard Warning - Indicates that blizzard conditions (low visibility of less than 1/4 mile due to

falling and/or blowing snow, and winds at least 35 mph) are expected for at least 3 hours.

To alert the public about <u>Floods</u>, the <u>National Weather Service</u> explains the difference between a Flood Advisory, Watch, and Warning. <u>https://www.weather.gov/safety/flood-watch-warning</u>

Flash Flood Warning - *Take Action!* Issued when a flash flood is imminent or occurring. If you are in a flood prone area move immediately to high ground. A flash flood is a sudden violent flood that can take from minutes to hours to develop. It is even possible to experience a flash flood in areas not immediately receiving rain.

Flood Warning - *Take Action!* Issued when the hazardous weather event is imminent or already happening. A Flood Warning is issued when flooding is imminent or occurring.

Flood Watch - *Be Prepared!* Issued when conditions are favorable for a specific hazardous weather event to occur. Issued when conditions are favorable for flooding but may not occur.

Flood Advisory - *Be Aware!* Issued when a specific weather event that is forecast to occur may become a nuisance. It is issued when flooding is not expected to be bad enough to issue a warning. However, it may cause significant inconvenience, and if caution is not exercised.

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Emergency Weather

Tornado Watch - *Be Prepared and lookout for problems*. Tornadoes are possible in and near the watch area.

Tornado Warning - *Take Action by immediately seeking shelter!* A tornado has been sighted in your area or indicated by weather radar. Immediately take shelter in interior room of your house, such as a basement, basement bathroom, or a bathroom in the middle of your house so that the pipes in the wall can provide protection.

<u>Suggestion</u> - Put on a Bicycle Helmet, Football Helmet, or put a large metal pot on your head! Regardless how it looks; it could save your life!

To alert the public about <u>**High Winds**</u>, the <u>National Weather Service</u> explains the difference between a Wind Advisory, Watch, and Warning. <u>https://www.weather.gov/safety/wind-ww</u>

<u>High Wind Warning</u> - *Take Action!* Sustained, strong winds with even stronger gusts are happening. Seek shelter. If you are driving, keep both hands on the wheels and slow down. The National Weather Service offices issue this product based on local criteria.

<u>High Wind Watch</u> - *Be Prepared!* Sustained, strong winds are possible. Secure loose outdoor items and adjust plans as necessary so you're not caught outside. The National Weather Service offices issue this product based on local criteria.

<u>Wind Advisory</u> - *Be Aware!* Strong winds are occurring but are not so strong as to warrant a High Wind Warning. Objects that are outdoors should be secured and caution should be taken when driving. The National Weather Service offices issue this product based on local criteria.

Dust Storm Warning - *Take Action!* Is issued when visibility of 1/2 mile or less due to blowing dust or sand, and wind speeds of 30 miles an hour or more

Severe Thunderstorm Watch - *Be Prepared!* Issued when severe thunderstorms are possible in and near the watch area. Winds 58 mph or higher and/or <u>Hail</u> 1 inch or larger are possible in a severe thunderstorm. Secure items outdoors that may blow around in high winds. Stay informed and be ready to Take Action.

Severe Thunderstorm Warning - *Take Action!* Issued when severe thunderstorms is happening or is imminent in the warning area. Severe thunderstorms have wind 58 mph or higher and/or <u>Hail</u> 1 inch or larger. Seek shelter inside a sturdy building, away from windows.

<u>Gale Warning</u> - *Take Action!* Issued for locations along the water when one or both of the following conditions is expected to begin within 36 hours and is not directly associated with a tropical cyclone - sustained winds of 34 to 47 knots (39 to 55 mph) or frequent gusts (duration of two or more hours) between 34 knots and 47 knots.

<u>Hurricane Force Wind Warning</u> - *Take Action!* Issued for locations along the water when one or both of the following conditions is expected to begin within 36 hours and not directly associated with a tropical cyclone - sustained winds of 64 knots or greater or frequent gusts (duration of two or more hours) of 64 knots (74 mph) or greater.

* NWS defines a severe thunderstorm as measured wind gusts to at least 58 mph, and/or hail to at least one inch in diameter, and/or a tornado. All thunderstorm categories imply lightning and the potential for flooding. Categories are also tied to the probability of a severe weather event within 25 miles of your location.

<u>Thunderstorms Non-severe</u> (TSTM) (Light Green) - General or non-severe thunderstorms - Delineates, to the right of a line, where a 10% or greater probability of thunderstorms is forecast during the valid period.

1 - <u>Marginal Risk</u> (MRGL) (Dark Green) - An area of severe storms of either limited organization and longevity, or very low coverage and marginal intensity.

2 - <u>Slight Risk</u> (SLGT) (Yellow) - An area of organized severe storms, which is not widespread in coverage with varying levels of intensity.

3 - <u>Enhanced Risk</u> (ENH) (Orange) - An area of greater (relative to Slight risk) severe storm coverage with varying levels of intensity.

4 - <u>Moderate Risk</u> (MDT) (Red) - An area where widespread severe weather with several tornadoes and/or numerous severe thunderstorms is likely, some of which should be intense. This risk is usually reserved for days with several supercells producing intense tornadoes and/or <u>very large hail</u>, or an intense squall line with widespread damaging winds.

Fire Danger Levels Description IRE DANGER Fuels do not ignite readily from small firebrands, although a more intense heat source such as LOW lightning may start many fires in duff or punky wood. Fires in open cured grassland may burn freely a few hours after rain, but woods fire spread slowly by creeping or smoldering and burn in irregular fingers. There is little danger of spotting. The color code is green. Low Fires can start from most accidental causes, but with the exception of lightning fires in some areas, DANGER the number of starts is generally low. Fires that develop headway in heavy slash or in conifer stands may be unmanageable while the extreme burning conditions last. Under these conditions, the only **Extreme** effective and safe control action is on the flanks until the weather changes, or the fuel supply

lessens. The color code is red.

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Fuel + Oxygen (from the air) = Combustion Products (mainly $CO_2 + H_2O$) + Heat Energy <u>Fire Triangle</u> - Illustrates the three elements a fire needs to ignite: Heat, Fuel and Oxygen. For fire to start, or have combustion, the fuel must be heated to ignition temperature that varies by the fuel.

<u>Combustion</u> - A chemical reaction that occurs when *fuel reacts with the Oxygen* in the air to release heat energy that *can only occur between gases*. Depending on the amount of Oxygen available *Combustion can be fast or slow*.

<u>Burning</u> - When plenty of Oxygen is available, combustion results in a flame that moves very fast. During the chemical reaction that produces fire, fuel is heated to such an extent that it releases gases from its surface, if not already a gas.

<u>Only Gases Can React in Combustion</u> - Gases are made up of molecules (groups of atoms). When these gases are *hot enough, the molecules in the gases break apart* and <u>fragments of molecules</u> rejoin with Oxygen from the air to make new product molecules – Water Molecules (H₂O) and Carbon Dioxide Molecules (CO_2) – and other products if the burning is Incomplete.

<u>Ignite</u> - When *heated molecules are loosened*, they movie apart to form a gas. The *gas molecules combine with the Oxygen* in the air, resulting in burning. The heat generated by the reaction is what sustains the fire. The heat of the flame will keep the remaining fuel at ignition temperature. The flame ignites the gases released and the fire spreads. <u>They say the size of a fire doubles every 30 seconds</u>.

<u>Complete Combustion</u> - Produced when there *is enough* Oxygen to combine completely with the fuel gas and the burning fuel, which will produce only Water and Carbon Dioxide (no smoke or other products). The *flame is typically blue*.

<u>Incomplete Combustion</u> - Produced when there is *not enough Oxygen available* during a chemical reaction, and products such as *Carbon (C) and Carbon Monoxide (CO) as well as Water and Carbon Dioxide* are produced. Less heat energy is released during Incomplete Combustion than Complete Combustion. The *burning flame is typically yellow or orange* and there is smoke.

<u>Smoke</u> - Incomplete Combustion – A collection of *Tiny Unburned Solid, Liquid and Gas Particles.* Although smoke can contain hundreds of different chemicals and fumes, visible smoke is mostly *Carbon (Soot), Tar, Oils and Ash.*

Fire Extinguisher - An active fire protection device used to extinguish or control small fires.

<u>Dry Chemical - Sodium Bicarbonate</u> - Prevents combustion with <u>Smothering Carbon Dioxide</u>. <u>Wet Chemical - Potassium Carbonate</u> - Forms *air-excluding <u>Soapy Foam Blanket</u>* on the fuel. <u>Foam - Aqueous Film-forming Foam</u> - The most common type of portable foam extinguishers. It is applied to fuel fires as either an aspirated (mixed and expanded with air in a branch pipe) or nonaspirated to create a <u>Frothy Foam Blanket</u> seal on fuel, preventing oxygen to reach it.

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Converting Between Celsius and Fahrenheit Temperatures

Celsius is <u>used by all countries except</u> the United States, the Bahamas, Belize, the Cayman Islands and Liberia. When traveling internationally, an easy way to convert between Celsius (C) and Fahrenheit (F) temperatures is that some temperatures maybe *reversed or transposed* to the others:

16° C is about 61° F 28° C is about 82° F

From that number, add or subtract to arrive at the approximate temperature. (Created by my son Johnny Goldhamer while traveling in Europe)

Minus Forty Below Zero (-40) is the same equal point on the Celsius and Fahrenheit scales.

For Length, 1 Meter (m) is equal to about 1 Yard or a little over 3 Feet. (1 meter = 3.28 Feet or 3' 4")

Personal Travel Code

Before friends or relatives travel internationally or on a long trip, set up a *Personal Travel Code* like the traveler's *Birthday Month (July)* or *Day (31)*. If a Scammer calls asking for money pretending to be the traveler simply ask for the *Personal Travel Code* and if they cannot provide it, hang up.

A Personal Travel Code could also be assigned to children, so the right person picks them up.

Voter Registration Card

When traveling overseas, place your Voter ID Card in a different place than your passport, such as a shaving kit or makeup bag. If your passport is lost or stolen, your Voter ID Card will be your Proof of U.S. Citizenship. Your Driver's License does not prove citizenship.

<u>Frame Suitcase</u> is a hard-sided wheeled suitcase that has lightweight aluminum-alloy frames, is highly resistant to impact, can be sealed tight with two combination locks, and has no outer zippers. Frame Suitcases, with TSA-approved combination locks set to two different codes can act as a Safe, protecting valuables when out of sight, such as in a Hotel, Motel, or Airbnb.

<u>Zipper Suitcases</u> with an outer edge zipper frequently need repair because the zipper pops and can be easily broken into by prying open the zipper coil with a pointy sharp object.

Emergency Cash

Hide Emergency Cash in a cell phone case and hidden in a wallet. Fold \$1 for change and a \$20 bill.

Interest Income

Interest is better than Issues. It is better to have Return on Principal than to Stand on Principle.

Income, Purchases, and Discounts

A discount is not income, but only a lower cost. Think of finance starting with a straight line at zero.

When income is received, such as from a job, dividends, interest, or a pension; the value is a positive number above the zero line.

When a purchase is made, the cost is a negative number below the zero line, but if discounted, the cost is not as far below the zero line. For example, starting at zero, if shoes are purchased for \$100, the cost is \$100 below the zero line, but if discounted at 10%, the cost is only \$90 below the zero line.

Credit Unions

Generally, most Credit Unions do not charge fees for checking or Credit Cards. Virginia has 187 Credit Unions (<u>http://ncuso.org/va</u>), but some to the largest local ones are *Virginia Credit Union, Call Federal Credit Union, and Navy Federal Credit Union.*

Diversify Investments

<u>Kiplinger's Personal Finance</u> - *Owning a mix of stocks, bonds and cash* may cause your portfolio to lag when stocks are going gangbusters, but you'll hold up better when stocks slide.

Personally, I diversify my investments by dividing my 401(k) and 457 Retirement Investments into:

1/3 Stock Hedge Funds 1/3 Corporate Bond Hedge Funds 1/3 U.S. Treasury Funds

If the market goes down, it is only a paper loss, and nothing is lost until a stock is sold!

"Buy Right, Hold Tight, and Don't Peek" - said Jack Bogle, founder of Vanguard, the first Index Fund.

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Traditional IRA or Roth IRA

The IRS has *fifteen different types of retirement plans*, but eight of the most popular plans are: Individual Retirement Account (IRA), Roth IRA, SEP IRA, 401(k), 403(b), 457, 409A, SIMPLE IRA <u>https://www.irs.gov/retirement-plans/plan-sponsor/types-of-retirement-plans</u>

For 2022, the IRA or Roth IRA Annual Contribution Limit is \$6,000 or \$7,000 if age 50 or older. https://www.nerdwallet.com/article/investing/roth-ira-contribution-limits

<u>Difference Between an IRA and a 401(k)</u> - Both are great options for tax-advantaged retirement saving, as you don't pay any taxes on the growth of your investments. Anyone who has earned income (Paycheck) and is below age 72 can contribute to a traditional IRA, while only people who are employed at a company that offers a 401k can contribute to a 401k.

<u>Traditional IRA (Individual Retirement Account)</u> - Allows individuals to direct <u>pre-tax income</u> toward investments that can grow tax-deferred. The IRS assesses no income taxes until the beneficiary makes a *withdrawal*. <u>Can Reduce Fed-1040 Tax Liability</u>. <u>https://www.investopedia.com/terms/t/traditionalira.asp</u>

<u>Roth IRA</u> - A special retirement account where you <u>pay taxes on money going into</u> your account [after tax income] and then all future withdrawals are tax-free. <u>https://www.investopedia.com/terms/r/rothira.asp</u>

<u>Personally</u>, I think it is better to invest and let accounts grow further with <u>pre-tax income</u>, which is about 20% more than investing with <u>after tax income</u>, if you are in the 20% Income Tax Bracket. Tax Laws are constantly changing, and I believe that it is better to invest with <u>pre-tax income</u> now and not worry about future taxes, <u>especially if you have many years before retirement</u>, because the Tax Laws Might Change. There are many examples.

In 2020, the <u>SECURE Act</u> (<u>Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement</u>) pushed back the age at which retirement plan participants need to take RMD (Required Minimum Distribution) from 70¹/₂ to 72, <u>for those who are Not</u> <u>70¹/₂</u> by the end of 2019 and allows Traditional IRA owners to keep making contributions indefinitely from earned income. <u>https://www.investopedia.com/what-is-secure-act-how-affect-retirement-4692743</u>

<u>RMD (Required Minimum Distribution</u>) - Is the amount of money that must be withdrawn yearly from a Traditional, SEP, or SIMPLE Individual Retirement Account (IRA) by owners and qualified plan participants of a certain age. <u>https://www.investopedia.com/terms/r/requiredminimumdistribution.asp</u>

Uncle Sam was willing to let accounts grow tax-deferred to save more, but eventually he demands his cut.

U.S. Postal Service Proof of Mailing and Delivery of Documents

Since large organizations are very busy, when important documents must be sent by a deadline, send it by fax or email and also mail a copy using the U.S. Postal Service by using either:

 U.S. Postal Service Form PS 3817- Certificate of Mailing- Provides official proof an item was mailed at a Post Office, but it does <u>not</u> provide a tracking number to prove it was delivered. In 2021, the cost is a First-Class Mail letter \$.55 Plus \$1.55 for a Certificate of Mailing, *Totaling \$2.10*.
 U.S. Postal Service Form 3800- Certified Mail Receipt- (Bank form at PO)- Provides official proof letter mailed at PO but provides tracking number to prove it was delivered. 2021 cost First-Class Mail \$.55 Plus \$3.60 Certified Mail Receipt *Totals \$4.15. Return Receipt Card, Form 3811 not needed.*

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U.S. Series E.E. Savings Bonds

Keep older U.S. Series E.E. Savings Bonds until 30 years, when they stop accumulating interest. They accumulate *about 4% Annual Interest,* which is better than a bank's interest rate, are guaranteed by the government, and only when they are cashed they are only taxed at the federal level, but generally not at the state or local levels.

U.S. Series I Savings Bonds

U.S. Series I Savings Bonds are a great investment, which accumulate the *going Rate of Interest, Plus an Inflation Rate*. <u>www.treasurydirect.gov/indiv/research/indepth/ibonds/res_ibonds.htm</u>

As of 2012, paper savings bonds are no longer sold at financial institutions, but may be purchased by opening a <u>Treasury Direct Account</u> <u>www.treasurydirect.gov</u>

Banks and Brokers will not mention U.S. I Bonds because they cannot receive a commission.

Pay Off Loans Early with Extra Payment Toward Principal

Under the *Rule of 78,* banks apply payments toward interest first, and then Principal (amount you borrowed). If you have extra money, make extra payments to the bank, but ask that it be applied to *'Principal Only'* and not monthly payment, but continue the monthly payments. Loan will Pay Off early!

Credit Card or Debit Card

Use a Credit Card especially for services, which provides the *Right of Recourse* through the bank against a vendor who does not provide a usable product or service. Debit Cards do not have this right and are immediately charged to an account, while Credit Cards have 20 to 25 days to pay.

Draw a Straight Line Instead of Signing on Credit Card Terminal Pads

When charging on a credit card and the system requires a signature on a Terminal Pad, Just *Draw a Straight Line* rather signing, because your signature will be digitized, then it can be duplicated on a contract, and you cannot prove you did not sign it. The law provides that lines with X and Y Axis (horizontal and vertical) are a signature, but a straight line is not a valid signature if duplicated.

Cut Up Old Credit Cards through the Chip

When cutting up old credit cards, make sure you cut through the oval chip to prevent it from working.

Keep Wallet in Hand

To remember to receive a credit card back at a store, keep your wallet in hand until they return it.

Keep Wallet Corners Pointing Up in Pants

By having the Wallet Corners Pointing Up in pants, it is more difficult for pickpockets to grab and also stops the wallet corners from creating a hole in the pants.

Credit Security Freeze (Free)

Starting 2018 the *Fair Credit Reporting Act* (FCRA), added the *Economic Growth, Regulatory Relief,* and Consumer Protection Act, which requires nationwide consumer reporting agencies to provide *national security freezes free of charge* to consumers to prevent new accounts from being opened, by scammers. It requires electronic application and provides a PIN to deactivate it if applying for credit.

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Place Tax Documents in Large Open-End Brown Envelope

In the beginning of each year get a <u>Large Open-End Kraft (Brown) 9" x 12" Envelope</u>, mark it in large letters the Tax Year, such as 2018. Keep the Envelope some place where you can always find it.

During the year, as you receive <u>Deductible Expenses</u> like Donations, Summary of Medical Expenses, Real Estate Taxes, Personal Property Tax, and <u>Income Information</u>; W-2, 1099, Bank Statements, place all of these Important Tax information in the Envelope.

When W-2's, 1099's, and other important Tax Documents come in the U.S. mail around the end of January, put those items in the Envelope too.

Then everything is in one place ready for you to file your Tax Returns.

The new Schedules 1 through 6 may be attached to the New Federal Simplified Form 1040.

For numerous years, I have been an Authored Tax Law Expert with Education and Experience in all Business Disciplines, and I am retired from the Virginia Department of Taxation.

Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017 (2017 Trump Tax Act)

As you know, the recently signed Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017 (2017 Trump Tax Act) increases the Individual Income Tax Standard Deduction, but removes Personal Deductions; and for Itemized Deductions, places a cap on State and Local Tax (SALT) Deductions, Mortgage Interest Deductions and removes the Equity Loan Interest Deduction; so that effective 2018, fewer taxpayers will be able to Itemize their Deductions.

Under Current and 2018 Law, Charitable Contributions are Only Deductible If a Taxpayer Itemizes

Under current and 2018 law, Charitable Contributions are only deductible if a taxpayer itemizes their Individual Income Tax return on Schedule A, but if they take a Standard Deduction, a Charitable Contribution Deduction is not available.

From 1982 to 1986 Form 1040 Provided a Non-itemizer Line Item Charitable Contribution Deduction

Nonetheless, from 1982 to and including 1986, the Federal Form 1040 provided a Line Item Charitable Contribution Deduction for non-itemizers, but it was eliminated with the Tax Reform Act of 1986 (1986 Reagan Tax Act). For example, the <u>1985 Form 1040</u> provided a *Line Item Charitable Contribution Deduction for non-itemizers* stating:

"Line 34b. If you do not itemize but you made charitable contributions, enter your cash contributions here. (If you gave \$3,000 or more to any one organization, see page 14.) Line 34c Enter your noncash contributions (you must attach Form 8283 if over \$500)."

Summary Conclusion

By sponsoring a bill to add a *Line Item Charitable Contribution Deduction* to the Federal Form 1040 for non-itemizers; similar to the 1982 to and including 1986 returns you would delight the 501(c)(3) Charitable Institutions as well as help the Taxpayers of the U.S. to save. Thank you.

Reflection

As you know, generally when localities increase real estate assessments, rather than evaluating all the property in the locality they simply determine that because of improvements in the locality, each parcel of land was now worth more. Subsequently, real estate tax assessments, which are based on value, are increased.

I noted in the news that because some homes are not worth the mortgage owed, certain mortgage interest rates are increasing, some homeowners are walking away from the property, or the banks are foreclosing on the homes for nonpayment, creating a U.S. mortgage crisis.

I propose that Congress pass and the President sign into law, a bill I call a "Value Added Bill," increasing the value of all parcels and automobiles in the United States by 10%, based on improvements to U.S. infrastructure and the fact that we are protected by a strong military.

At one time, the NADA Blue Book for evaluating automobiles, listed three evaluations: Retail, Wholesale, and Loan-value. The *"Value Added Bill,"* could include two valuations of parcels and automobiles: one for loan purposes and other for selling. In addition, the *"Value Added Bill,"* could also prevent local and state governments from increasing taxes based on the new valuations.

Caveats

Inflation may be an important side effect of the *"Value Added Bill."* Nevertheless, if this law allows the increase valuation for loan purposes only, then perhaps it may not cause inflation. In addition, perhaps the rules for calculating the United States Gross National Income or other treaties may prevent using a new valuation from the *"Value Added Bill."*

As such, the borrower pays a larger part of the total interest earlier in the term. [and a lesser amount toward principal] (Explanation added) <u>https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Rule_of_78s</u>

A Simple Solution

If the President issued an Executive Order for the Department of Education to recalculate the Student Loan Payments to apply to Principal first and Interest second, back 15 years to 2008, then the Student Loan Borrowers would owe less, and some student loans would be paid. By paying more on Principal earlier, then the borrowers pay less interest.

There is not any reason for the Federal Government to follow profitable banking methods for calculating payments that forces borrowers to pay more. Congress and the U.S. Supreme Court should not object to this recalculation method to help Student Loan Borrowers.

A Zero or a Negative Cannot Be Proved. The Relationship Between Different Companies Use Tax Paid is a False Proposition and a Contrapositive Argument

Dear Mr. M:

As you know, the State of Washington, Department of Revenue, Annual Excise Detail for T, Inc. lists a small amount of Gross Receipts.

During the audit period, T, Inc. did not have any State of Washington Rent, Property, or Payroll and only had a small amount of Washington State Gross Receipts from Project Numbers 1, 2, and 3" where a subsidiary corporation performed the work out of state.

Question 1. In your first email question, you asked:

"I wanted to see <u>what business activities</u> <u>T; Inc. conducted in Washington State</u> during the audit period that <u>resulted in \$0 use tax liability</u> reported. In other words, I would like to know <u>why T,</u> <u>Inc. did not report any use tax</u> during the audit period."

Answer 1. <u>A Zero or a Negative Number Cannot Be Proven or Explained</u>

Enclosed is a copy of the T, Inc. <u>Delaware Certificate of Dissolution</u> and Registered Agent detail, listing a Termination Date as 8/20/2009.

Next, a zero or a negative cannot be proven or explained. Using an example of a bank account; if there is nothing in a bank account, it is very easy to confirm the balance, but the question *why is it zero* can only be answered that nothing was deposited. The fact that nothing was deposited in the bank does not prove anything.

Because there is <u>not any evidence that something does not exist</u>, <u>does not mean there is</u> <u>evidence that something does exist</u>. It simply means that <u>there is insufficient information to "Prove" or</u> <u>"Explain" the proposition to be either true or false</u>.

Question 2. In your next email question, you asked:

"I wanted to clarify my question for T, Inc. to make it clearer for you.

Since <u>T</u>, Inc. engages in similar activities to other affiliates, which reported use tax during the audit period, please <u>list the factors</u> that in your opinion <u>resulted in the reporting of \$0</u> <u>use tax</u> by T, Inc. <u>as compared to other companies</u>. If one the factors is the smaller size of T, Inc., please <u>explain why T, Inc. would not report smaller amount of use tax liability</u>, <u>as opposed to no use tax liability</u> actually reported." [Emphasis added]

Answer 2.

Your suggestion that there is a relationship between the Use Tax Paid by a Larger Subsidiary and a Smaller Subsidiary because they are in similar fields is a false proposition and a "<u>Contrapositive or</u> <u>Contraposition Argument</u>."

In traditional logic, a *Contraposition* is a form of immediate inference in which <u>from a given</u> <u>proposition</u>, <u>another is inferred</u> having for its subject the contradictory of the original predicate, and in some cases involving a change of quality (affirmation or negation). <u>http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Contraposition_(traditional_logic)</u>

Contrapositive Arguments rightly utilize the transposition rule of inference in classical logic to conclude something like - To the extent, that C implies E then Not-E must also imply Not-C.

In other words, <u>if a cause always leads to an effect</u>, <u>then the absence of the expected effect is</u> <u>evidence of absence of the cause</u>. For example, if the causal proposition that if it's <u>raining outside then</u> <u>the streets will be wet</u> is assumed, then it can be assumed that if the streets are not wet then it is not raining outside. The inference that it cannot be raining outside because the streets are not getting wet is exactly as true, or perhaps exactly as untrue, as the original proposition. The statements are logically equivalent. <u>http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Argument_from_ignorance</u>

In law, this "*cause always leading to an effect,*" is referred to as "*Judicial notice*" or "*Judicial knowledge.*" Black's Law Dictionary Ninth Edition, defines "*Judicial notice*" as follows:

"A courts acceptance, for purposes of convenience and without requiring a party's proof, of a <u>well-known and indisputable fact</u>; the court's power to accept such a fact, <the trial court took judicial notice of the fact that water freezes at 32 Fahrenheit>. Fed R. Evid 201."

Your proposition that there is a relationship between the Use Tax Paid by a Larger Subsidiary and a Smaller Subsidiary because they are in similar fields is not a cause that always leads to the same effect or an indisputable fact and therefore a <u>False Proposition</u> and a <u>Contraposition Argument</u>.

In addition, as in most states, Washington State Registered Sales Tax Vendors usually charge the correct Sales Tax. Generally, most service industries pay Use Tax when a vendor does not charge Sales Tax. The fact that according to the Washington State records, T, Inc. Gross Receipts for services during the audit period was small, only indicates that a minuscule amount of purchases were made, of which they most likely included Washington Sales Tax from the vendor.

Non-Compete Agreements (NCA)

Job Seeking Documents

Job Seeking Documents are similar to the Charles Dickens story of Mr. Scrooge's three visitors -

Your *Résumé* is the *"Spirit of Job Seeker's Past,"* Your *Cover Letter* is the *"Spirit of Job Seeker's Present,"* Your *Marketing Plan* is the *"Spirit of Job Seeker's Future."*

With these three "Spirits" or "Representations," you will succeed!

Job Seeking is all about "You"

Know - What value will you bring to a company? *Show* - By using Business Cards, Emails, LinkedIn, Websites, Etc. *Grow* - By helping others with what you learned and passing it along. It's *"Trickle-down Good Deeds." Dough* - Soon you will have success!

Business Cards — A Little Window to You

Business Cards are another tool to help you network by providing your contact information, your field or title, and perhaps a logo, which promotes and recognizes you or your field. Today, any office supply store can print reasonably priced business cards.

Interviews, 30-second, and Elevator Speeches

It's the First Name Last Name Show, and you are Star!

Spoken Words are Different from Written Words

Spoken words are easier "Digested" or Understood. Contractions, such as "I'm," remain acceptable.

Bullet Points

A Job Description Bullet Point states, "Every day I inhaled and exhaled." An Achievement Bullet Point states, "I exhaled blowing up a balloon that traveled 9 feet."

Try to use Achievement Bullet Points.

Remembering Achievements

If you cannot recall some of your achievements and you need something to spark your memory, open *LinkedIn.com* and in the Top Search Bar, key your field, such as IT. Filters will appear on the right allowing you to search by Name, Title, Industry, Company, or Location. By keying a title, you may discover someone with an achievement that *reminds you that you had the same achievement*.

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Letter Letterhead

To make a *Centered Professional Letterhead*, display all information in Bold using a 12-font size. Your name should be a little larger with a 13-font size. Center your contact information — Town / City / State, Cell Phone Number, Email and LinkedIn. Do not list your street address; it is not necessary. List your Cell Phone, but do not list your landline unless it is your only phone. After your name, list your credentials such as PhD, MBA, J.D., CPA, or PMP.

For a second page, copy your contact information into a header, but *Left justify* them to the left side of the page so it looks different than the first page and add a simple 2 to the footer at the bottom.

Bottom Border Line

To offset the letterhead from the body of the cover letter, add three empty lines or spaces, and then on the middle line, add a Bottom Border line by clicking the *Borders Drop Down Box* so that the line goes across the page.

Human nature will automatically start reading below a line at the top of a page.

Emails Letters

It is that *little extra difference* that raises the status of the sender in the eyes of the receiver.

Email Address

John B. Goldhamer

<u>First Name.Last Name@</u>. To make your name stand out, use a Capital letter for the first letter of your first and last name and a place a Dot (.) in between them to offset the name, which makes it easier for the human eye to read. Software does not need or recognize the dot.

First Name.Last Name.IT , *First Name.Last Name .804* , *First Name.Last Name.RIC* If you have a common name, after your name add an occupation, area code, or city abbreviation with Dots (.) in between.

Try not to use an underscore (J_G@), which disperses when the email address is auto underlined.

All the cool guys use Free Gmail that provides better protection against scammers using top algorithm. Many Internet carriers allow free multiple email addresses, so register a new name, but keep the old email address you have used for a long time only for personal emails.

When applying for a job, Email addresses using older email services such AOL, Comcast, Hotmail, Outlook, Yahoo, or Verizon may show your age.

Marketing Plan

A Marketing Plan is a one-page document providing a brief Summary about you, your Target Companies, and Considerations: *Why you are the "Best of the Best."*

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(Continued)

Experience — Title First

Just as *LinkedIn* uses, since we read English from left to right, top to bottom the most important should be listed first.

On one line, start with Title, then the Company, City, State, and end with years.

Instead of underlining, add a line under the title, make it font size 1, and add a Bottom Border. To the Human eye it looks like an underline, but it does not touch any of the low hanging letters, but to software, it is just a line.

Education — Degree First

Since we read English from left to right, top down, start with your most recent degree or certificate, then the school, followed by the city and state.

We have been taught to list the school first, but unless you went to an Ivy League school, Recruiters are first interested in your degree followed by the school.

If you are older, do not list graduation dates. If an associate degree rolled into a bachelor, degree, then only list the bachelor's degree. List all degree disciplines even if in *"Basket Weaving."*

As a Phrase Summary Formula

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Job Fairs or Career Fairs

Job Fairs or Career Fairs are local conventions where companies are trying to *"Sell their Company to the Job Seekers."* Generally, they have a table showing something about the company and they are staffed by HR (Human Resources Employees) and other Employees.

Before the Job Fair, examine the list of companies attending and determine which companies are on your *Marketing Plan Target list*, have an opening in your field, or where you would like to work.

At the Job Fair collect as many Company Business Cards as possible for future references. Later if a company has an opening, the first line of your cover letter could be - <u>I met you the _____</u> Job Fair in July.

Salary Question — Bidding on a Job

Try not to be the first one listing a salary. When an Interviewer asks *what salary you are looking for*, first respond by saying:

"It is difficult to bid on a job without all the details."

The Interviewer may reply by questioning:

"Since you have the job description, what salary you are looking for?"

Then ask — *"What is the range for the position?"*

The Interviewer may respond — *"What is your range?"*

Simply say — "According to Salary.com, O*Net (or another salary website), the range for this job in this city is _ to _."

Thank You Notes

After you are interviewed send a Thank you email to the Interviewer. In today's world, thank you emails are acceptable, but open with:

"I appreciate you taking the time to interview me recently!"

Although writing "Thank you" is acceptable, it is just glanced over; while your appreciation shows a genuine excitement to work for the company.

For a more personal note, if you have a good handwriting, the day before the interview, on a *Formal Thank You Note Card*, prepare a thank you note addressed to the Interviewer. On your way out, leave it with the Receptionist.

If you make your job *Fun*, then management will be happy because *production increases* and the employee will be happy that the *time goes by quickly*.

To play, all an employee has to do is discover how to make your job Fun.

1. Take seconds to use the "*Wow Factor*," whenever you can:

If you are in Accounts Receivable, you may say to yourself:

Wow, I know where this company is located!

Wow, this is a really big sale!

Wow, this bill is a lot of pages!

Wow, this company's check has a photo of the headquarters!

If you are in Accounts Payable, you may say to yourself:

Wow, we purchase a lot of stuff from this company!

Wow, we get a good discount by paying early!

Wow, the purchase order does not match the supplier's invoice!

If you are in Payroll, you may say to yourself:

Wow, this employee is in our Wellness Program, which lowers all our insurance premiums! Wow, a lot of many employees deduct Flexible Spending plans and save a lot of money! Wow, we pay a lot of Payroll Tax to New York State, so maybe we have a lot of offices there!

If you deal with customers or employees names, you may say to yourself:

Wow, I have the same first name!

Wow, this customer has the same name as my cousin!

2. Take seconds to use the "Oh My Factor" or a silly statement when things are not as exciting:

If you discover your own error, don't get angry, just say to yourself, "Oh My!"

If you discover another employee's error, don't get angry, just say to yourself, "Oh My!"

If you discover a customer's error, don't get angry, just say to yourself, "Oh My!"

3. Take seconds to use the "<u>Yea Factor</u>," whenever you can:

If you are in Accounting or Tax, in only a few seconds you may have fun:

If you are Reconciling or Balancing Accounts, and they match say to yourself, "Yea!"

If you are researching the application of a law and find a great explanation say to yourself, "Yea!"

If you create Spreadsheets, *add some color*. When you finish the colors, say to yourself, "Yea!" Even though many office printers do not print in color, the receiver may appreciate it and take a stronger interest in the subject. You may even put a smile on their face when they see the colors.

4. Take seconds to use the "Smile and Laugh Factor" whenever you can:

If you make a mistake, take a few seconds to "Smile and Laugh" at yourself.

If someone says something that you think is funny do not hold it in just to be cool, "Smile and Laugh!"

If you are talking on the telephone, "Smile," your voice will be more convincing.

Smiles are Contagious, but you get Better Fast!

All these methods can be used at Home or in your Personal Life too:

- If someone at a store is very efficient and helps you a lot, use the "<u>Wow Factor</u>," by saying, "Wow, you really did a great job helping me and I appreciate your extra service!"
- If something does not go your way, instead of getting angry, just say to the person, "<u>Oh My</u>!" They will laugh or smile at the silly statement and then may be willing to find an alternative.
- Children could use these factors for chores, homework, or studying. They might learn something along the way as they *factor in fun into their world*.

Thinking It, Writing It, and Reading It; helps to develop new original ideas.

Word Economy is the practice of using fewer words to say more by eliminating redundant, unnecessary, cliché, or weak language.

Do not show a direction for a word by using 'Up' or 'Down.' When added to the end of some words, it is not needed to convey the thought.

For example after some words, do not include a direction to convey the thought:

'Up:' Add, Cheer, Clean, Cut, Drink, Eat, Fix, Get, Heat, Mix, Pick, Sit, Stand, Sum, Tear.

Down:' Back, Calm, Come, Close, Fall, go, Jot, Lie, Quiet Pull, Settle, Simmer, Wear.

Since the sky is up, it should not be written: "He looked 'Up' at the sky," but to save words, it should be written, "He looked at the sky."

When composing, try not to use 'You,' especially when reviewing someone's work.

For example, do not state "When you...," instead write "When ____ ing." By ending the next word with "ing" the sentence is shorter and reads easier without an accusation.

Concepts are a Continuum of Ideas; that change based on knowledge. The final idea may only resemble an initial idea as it flows toward a goal.
